HRH The King of Surakata, Indonesia

On 28 April, 2010, His Royal Highness KDYMM Sinuhun Paku Buwono XIII was inaugurated as GULL's first Pro Chancellor. As the senior king of three kingdoms in Indonesia, his family have occupied the Palace of Surakarta, Hadiningrat, Solo since 1745.

The King is a strong advocate of lifelong learning and he will serve as GULL's champion for Indonesia, particularly for the large numbers of people who have limited or no access to further and higher education.

Kingdom and Palace of Surakarta, Indonesia


In the early 20th century, Indonesia was divided into 350 greater and lesser kingdoms. Although Dutch imperialism had influenced this pattern, the political history of the archipelago over the centuries had been marked by the expansion and contraction of spheres of influence. One of the oldest and most powerful centres of power has always been located in central Java. The court of Surakarta Hadiningrat, formed in the 1740s, can trace its origins to kingdoms of the 8th century.

In 1945 the ancient kingdoms were superseded by the newly-formed Republic of Indonesia. The courts with their panoply of ancient traditions gave away to a new political ethos in which individual achievement replaced aristocratic birth as the main criterion for success. Overnight the courts lost their political power and rulers lost both inherited power and traditional sources of income. Many simply disappeared, while others clung to a precarious existence as tourist attractions or cultural centres.

Java is now home to over 100 million people. Two-thirds of these belong to the ethnic group known as Javanese. The past half-century has seen rapid social change, usually peaceful, but occasionally marked by extreme violence. Javanese culture is known for its high degree of refinement and devotion to ideas of spirituality and etiquette. This stereotype, fostered in part by Dutch colonial influence, masks a much richer complexity.
